Thank you so much for choosing to donate food to the Hammersmith & Fulham Foodbank for your Harvest Collection this year. Every gift, big or small, makes all the difference to us and the people we are helping. I am delighted to let you know that your donation weighed 167.1kg. Your support for our work is greatly appreciated.

During 2018, our emergency food parcels have 'fed' an average of 1,000 people* per calendar month. That's roughly 10,000 meals per month. All of our clients are referred to us, and professional advice is normally available to them to ensure that we are helping people out of crisis in the long term.

I would be grateful if you could extend our thanks to all the staff, children and parents who were involved and Ms James who organised it. Your generosity makes it possible for us to continue do what we do whist so many people struggle to manage at this time.
